When doctors insist that her mother must leave the city or she will have not long to live, Niloofer is torn between family loyalty, and living her own life.

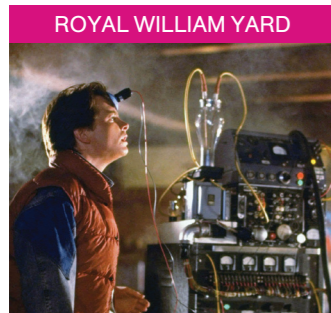


The Shallows (15)
