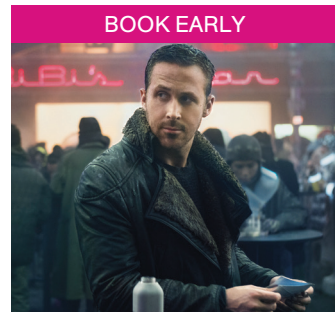

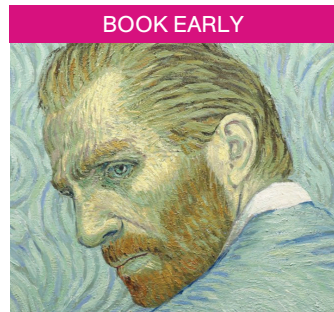

**Daphne** (15)

This striking drama, which wowed the Edinburgh Film Festival, follows the life of an early-thirties Londoner who goes off the rails after witnessing a random act of violence. Daphne does a brilliant job of capturing the subtle emotions of this most complex of women - and the world around her.



**The Death of Stalin** (15)

Acerbic send-up of the Soviet dictator and the battle for power after his sudden demise. A timely allegory about venal, unfit leaders and corrupt governance - it's the kind of comedy that has become Iannucci's (The Thick of It, In the Loop) specialty. Brilliant!



**The Killing of a Sacred Deer** (tbc)

Interlacing elements of Greek tragedy, surrealism and absurdist horror, Yorgos Lanthimos' follow-up to The Lobster is a deliciously twisted and slyly macabre morality tale.

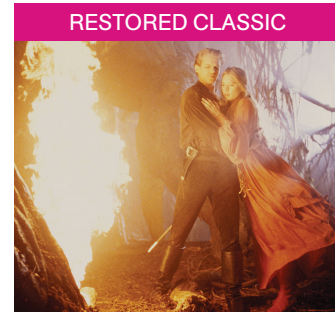


PROGRAMMER'S PICK

**The Florida Project** (15)

A story of childhood, set against the backdrop of America's failed economy. Six-year-old Moonee lives with her mother in a candy-floss-coloured motel in Orlando. Narrated from a child's-eye view, this is a marvellous world of play and possibility. But adult viewers witnessing this life will suspect what's coming for Moonee.

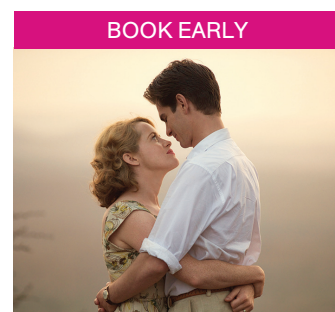
